Policy Title: **Standing Committees**

Student Achievement Committee

This committee consists of two or three Board members who shall work with the Associate Superintendent and other appropriate administrative team members.

The primary duties of the Student Achievement Committee shall be to:

1. Review student achievement related topics on which the Board will be voting.
2. Review student achievement strategies and set key benchmarks to assess success in meeting set goals.
3. Evaluate high school graduation requirements to assure students are adequately prepared for post-secondary education or work upon graduation.
4. Recommend goals and review strategies to increase attendance rate; graduation rate; and reduce the drop-out rate.
5. Evaluate programs and strategies to serve and challenge all students.

Finance Committee

The committee shall consist of the Board Treasurer and two or three Board members.

The primary duties of the Finance Committee shall be to:

1. Refine and implement enhancements to the business and financial operating procedures.

2. Develop and maintain a five-year plan for maintenance.
3. Review and make recommendations regarding building projects.
4. Review and update finance related policies.
5. Set key financial benchmarks to assess success in meeting goals.
6. Schedule program evaluations and review findings of studies.

Policy/Personnel Committee

This committee shall consist of two or three Board members who shall work with the Superintendent and other appropriate administrative team members.

The duties of the Policy/Personnel Committee shall be to:

1. Work cooperatively with the Superintendent to review, update and keep current the District's policies.
2. Review hiring practices to attract and recruit the best teachers available.
3. Review District compensation plans.
4. Periodically conduct employee surveys to obtain feedback on what is needed to better serve children.
5. Review plans and strategies to acknowledge effective teachers and offer struggling teachers the professional support needed to be more successful.

Public Relations Committee

This committee shall consist of two or three Board members who shall work with the Superintendent and other appropriate administrative team members.

The primary duties of the Public Relations Committee shall be to:

1. Develop and review strategies for increasing parent involvement in District schools.
2. Develop and review strategies to improve communication to parents and the community.
3. Develop and review strategies to improve customer service and become more community service minded.
